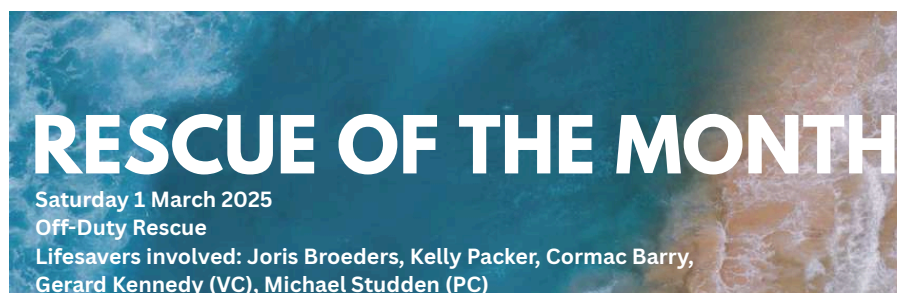
A German tourist was rescued in rough surf at dusk after being swept beyond the break. Spotting danger from the clubhouse balcony during a private function, the team responded without hesitation. Cody paddled out through fading light and challenging surf, returning the swimmer safely to shore. This rescue was recognised as the Northern Beaches Rescue of the Month for March.



A mass rescue involving six swimmers in strong rips and deteriorating surf. Swift action, technical IRB manoeuvres, and coordinated medical care resulted in the safe recovery of all patients, including one in respiratory distress. A textbook display of teamwork under pressure.



An early morning bluebottle sting emergency involving respiratory distress at Cabbage Tree Bay. Despite being off-duty, the team administered oxygen, monitored vitals, and managed the scene calmly and professionally for over an hour until both patients stabilised.



A face-down unconscious swimmer was identified and rescued in the flagged area during patrol hours. On his very first patrol, Joris initiated the rescue. Lifesavers quickly administered oxygen and called for paramedics. The patient regained consciousness and was transported safely to hospital.

Of particular note was the significant participation uplift in our junior ranks, affirming the success of our inclusive, family-friendly programs and our club’s reputation as a nurturing ground for the next generation of lifesavers.

We also saw impressive contributions from our active membership base, with many individuals volunteering over 50 hours of service. These efforts resulted in **28 rescues** and **2,203** preventative actions, helping to keep Manly Beach safe across the season.

Throughout the year, the membership team focused on streamlining renewals, strengthening onboarding, and enhancing member communications. Our thanks go to the dedicated registrars, age managers, patrol captains, and behind-the-scenes administrators who make it all possible. A key goal in the year ahead is improving active-to-associate retention, keeping members engaged beyond their core patrol years and creating pathways for community connection, mentoring, and volunteering. Please connect with our WhatsApp Communities to stay connected in the off-season.

Last year marked our second consecutive year of running the **Duke of Edinburgh’s International Award** program at Manly LSC, and it remains a strong and natural fit with the Surf Club, aligning well with our focus on community service, personal growth, and youth development. The Award encourages young people to challenge themselves across four key areas—Voluntary Service, Physical Recreation, Skills, and Adventurous Journey—fostering resilience, leadership, and a sense of civic responsibility. These values reflect the ethos of surf lifesaving and support our mission to develop confident and capable young members. We currently have 26 participants undertaking the award this year, and we proudly acknowledge the following participants who completed their Duke of Ed Award:

## Director of Risk

I am pleased to present to you the annual report of the Director of Risk for Manly Surf Lifesaving Club (MSLC) for the year 2024/2025. The past year has been one of challenges and opportunities, and I am proud to say that our Club and the management team has risen to meet them.

This year, we saw an increase in beach attendance and participation in Surf Lifesaving activities due to the easing of COVID-19 restrictions and other factors affecting our operational environment. As a result, there was a higher number of rescues and first aid incidents compared to previous years (2,973 First Aid events, 12,487 preventative actions, and 37 rescues). However, our volunteer lifesavers responded promptly and effectively, resulting in minimal injuries and no fatalities. Our risk management strategy has remained focussed on prevention, education, and preparedness. We have continued to develop a range of programs and initiatives aimed at improving the safety and wellbeing of our volunteers and MSLC event participants.

The major risks associated with the world’s largest community-based participative sporting event, the Cole Classic, were once again effectively managed through the development of comprehensive risk assessments, mitigation strategies and controls. These resulted in a greater number of preventative actions and fewer incidents requiring rescue or first aid. Developed in consultation with NSW Health, NSW Police, Northern Beaches Council, Surf Life Saving NSW and other key agencies, these plans ensured the safety of both participants and volunteers. Similar strategies were applied to the Summer of Surf Event, Nipper Nat’s and the Manly Open Carnivals. The success and continued financial viability of these events highlight the extensive work of the organising committees, who are to be congratulated.

The 2024/25 year will see further development in health and safety initiatives for Club members, with an increased focus on mental health, and exploration of technologies and innovations to enhance safety and improve operations. Risks associated with requests for assistance—particularly those linked to Surf Life Saving NSW’s affiliation with the NSW State Emergency Service—will also be a focus. This includes our recent deployments across the State supporting flood-affected communities, ensuring our members are safe in these environments. A broader risk assessment across all safety and compliance matters will also be undertaken in 2024/25, including risks linked to the proposed development and a review of existing security protocols to ensure a safe working environment for all.

The past year has been pivotal in strengthening our risk management framework. The initiatives undertaken have not only mitigated existing risks but have also helped prepare the organisation for future challenges. As we move forward, our commitment to proactive risk management will remain unwavering, ensuring the long-term success and stability of the Club.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all our volunteers, fellow Board Members and partners for their hard work and dedication over the past year. Your efforts have made a significant contribution to the safety and wellbeing of our communities.

Manly LSC has a proud history and a very bright future in surf sports competition. The wide-ranging objectives of our club, contained in our constitution, include:

- Being a premier competitive club in surf sports competition at Branch, NSW, Australian and World Championship competition
- To promote lifesaving competition to enhance the objectives of the Club as well as to foster sportsmanship and values which will, in turn, promote harmony within the Club and its relationship with the community; and
- To encourage Youth and Junior Activity members and their families to remain actively involved in surf lifesaving after they have finished their youth or junior activity programs.

More than 40% of our members compete in surf sports at Manly LSC. Our surf sports programs provide the club with a pool of healthy, fit and engaged members, from nippers having their first experiences in the ocean, to the huge range of members who love keeping fit, improving their skills and hanging out with their friends in the water, to highly competitive athletes striving for success on a national and international stage.

### 2024/25 Surf Sports Season Review

This has been a season of transition, laying strong foundations for continued success in surf sports competition at Manly LSC. We increased our competitor numbers across all divisions and achieved an exceptional retention rate of over 95%.

We finished 1<sup>st</sup> at Branch and 2<sup>nd</sup> in NSW across combined points scores for Nippers, Opens and Masters this season (8% behind Newport's combined points score), and with North Bondi were one of only two clubs to achieve a top 10 finish in all three divisions at state championships. At the Australian Championships, we finished 4<sup>th</sup> in the Youth category (u13, u14, u15), 24<sup>th</sup> in the Open category, and 5<sup>th</sup> in the Masters category.

Most importantly, this season, we have successfully addressed a major point of weakness that has undermined our club's progress over the last decade, with Manly no longer leaking young talent to other clubs, and now attracting young surf sports competitors from surrounding clubs once again.





## Director of Water Sports

By investing in our coaching programs under the leadership of Scott Thomson and Rachel Crerar and adopting the approach of “grow our own and make ourselves attractive”, we have returned to being a dominant force in the younger age groups at Branch, NSW State and Australian Championships level.

Our youth program is now firmly established as one of the leading surf sports programs in the world, with exceptional retention and conversion into the senior ranks. We have some of the strongest U13, U14, and U15 competitors in Australia and have begun to attract talent from surrounding clubs to be part of what we are building, with a substantial influx of U15, U17, and U19 competitors transferring to Manly LSC post-season. We expect to see this translate into very strong results at the U17 and U19 levels in the upcoming season, as well as beginning to bolster open teams.

Our master’s program continues to excel, dominating at Branch, finishing 2<sup>nd</sup> at NSW State and 5<sup>th</sup> at the Australian Championships. With greater integration between the various sections of the club, from youth through to opens and into masters, we have created a great training environment that is laying the foundations for sustained success across all areas of water sports at Manly LSC.

Whilst we have substantially increased the number of athletes making open finals at Branch, State, and Australian national championship levels, our senior team remains in a rebuilding phase. We have a very small cohort of open athletes currently capable of producing individual medal-winning performances and, in turn, lifting teams onto the podium at the highest level. Of that small group, at the end of last season, two key competitors relocated interstate, and several of our key athletes were hindered by injury and illness during peak events this season. As a result, whilst we made more finals than we have in many seasons, this did not translate to medals, resulting Opens points scores below expectations at NSW State and Australian Championships.

This will resolve as standards continue to lift and broaden across what is now a stable and growing team, and our talented youth transition through. We are excited to see large numbers of competitors back in training already for the upcoming season. We are confident we will see a strong progressive lift in points scores over the coming season as a result of sustained investment in our surf sports program.

### Key season highlights include:

- Outstanding combined nippers, youth, opens, and masters surf sports competition point scores at key events, showing the health and sustainability of our club overall:
- 1<sup>st</sup> Overall Sydney Northern Beaches Branch Championships
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Overall NSW State Championships
- Our Nippers competitors are dominating at the Branch level with more than double the point score of their nearest rivals, being the top performing club in NSW in water events this season and achieving a record 4<sup>th</sup> in water events at the Australian Youth Championships.
- Our Masters team achieved our best results on record, 1<sup>st</sup> at Branch, 2<sup>nd</sup> at NSW State and 5<sup>th</sup> at Aussies this season.
- 20% increase in Open finalists at Branch, State and Aussies.
- Keaten Ronge-Smith and Willem Riddington backing up last year’s u17 ski relay gold medal at Aussies with an u19 double ski silver medal at Aussies this season.

## Surf Sports Fundraising

Last season, we discussed the significant challenges posed by the rising costs of competing in surf sports, which have become a significant barrier to involvement for young adults.

We have addressed this with a Manly LSC Surf Sports Scholarships program now in place. Friends, family, supporters and sponsors can now make simple tax-deductible donations to support this initiative via the Australian Sports Foundation ([www.asf.org.au](http://www.asf.org.au)), by searching for Manly Surf Sports.

Manly LSC funds surf sports coaching and entry fees, and a partial subsidy for craft transport to Aussies and other events (in part funded by our athletes paying club competition and coaching fees). The costs borne directly by our athletes and their families include swim fees, purchase of equipment, travel and accommodation for an increasing volume of interstate events (Summer of Surf, Aussies, and if selected, Iron person series and state team events). These costs can range from \$5,000 (for limited events) to \$20,000 (for a full campaign) per season per athlete. Any assistance you and your network can provide to help fund these programs is greatly appreciated.

## Help Required

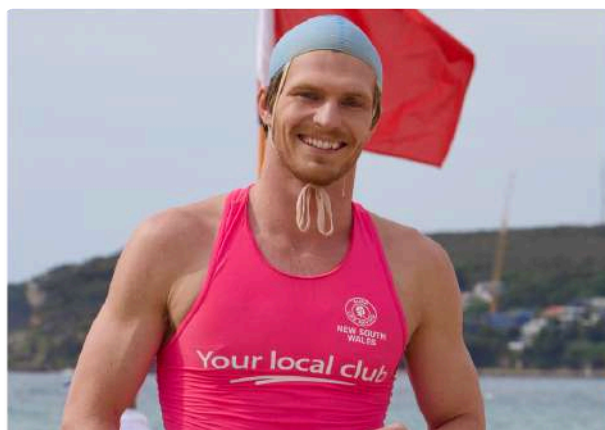

This season marked my first year as Director of Events, and I’m proud to reflect on what’s been a rewarding and action-packed year for Manly Life Saving Club: we successfully delivered three major events – Race One Nipper Nats, the Shaw and Partners World Ocean Series / Manly Open Surf Classic, and the 43rd Cole Classic – each showcasing the strength, commitment and teamwork of our club and community.

### **Race One Nipper Nats**

The Nipper Nats once again provided a fantastic day of competition and camaraderie for U9 to U14 athletes from across the country. The energy stayed high thanks to the tireless efforts of parents, officials and volunteers. Thank you to Race One for donating incredible prizes, and to Graham Bruce for his leadership. Our Manly Nippers thrived under the guidance of Rachel and Michael Kember and their coaching team—Nipper Nats results were a true reflection of their passion and commitment.

### **Shaw and Partners World Ocean Series / Manly Open Surf Classic**

First held in 1911, the Manly Carnival is one of Australia’s most iconic surf sports events. With generous support from Shaw and Partners, it’s now a key stop on the World Ocean Series, attracting top Australian talent and national broadcast coverage. This year brought wild weather, but thanks to rapid coordination with Council, lifeguards, and officials, we delivered a full weekend of racing. Manly’s unique beach orientation meant we stayed open while others cancelled. When Freshwater’s carnival was relocated, we teamed up to run a third day of racing at Manly. Huge credit to our JAC and incredible volunteers who showed up again and again—especially those on BBQ duty for three days straight!

### 43rd Cole Classic – The World’s Largest Ocean Swim

Another record-breaking year—entries sold out a month early, and smiles were everywhere. With nearly 6,000 participants, the Cole Classic retained its title as the world’s largest ocean swim for the fifth year running. Shelly Beach gave us a stunning start line, and conditions were ideal for a dream swim into Manly. A massive thank you to the Cole Classic Organising Committee: Mari Notaris, Mel Brock, Kathryn Watts, Jo Carmichael, Nick Edmonds, Craig Hood, Ken Murphy, Kate Martin, Madeline Osbon, Nicole Gorton, and race director John Thomson—you’re the heartbeat of the Cole. To our event partners—Barings, Cadigal, Felons Manly, Peninsula Orthopaedics, and Speedo—thank you for showing up and pitching in.

### Charity Impact:

This year, swimmers raised \$265,000, taking our total to over \$1.047 million since MSLC took over in 2020. Closer to home, we raised nearly \$200,000 for Manly Life Saving Club—our biggest fundraiser of the year—directly supporting lifesaving services, training, and equipment.

### Sustainability:

We made history with a world-first funded silicone swim cap recycling program, plus biodegradable water cups, plastic-free tags, food composting, and goggle reuse initiatives. The Cole is now proudly accredited as a Surfrider Foundation Ocean Friendly Event.

### Volunteers:

Behind every great event is a great team. With around 400 volunteers, we delivered a seamless experience. And those iconic Roger Harvey-designed tees? Still popping up across the peninsula!

The 2024/25 Season is over, and we can look back on a year where we performed well across all facets of competition, but we can do better.

The competition began with the ILS World Championships on the Gold Coast, with a small team attending. The number of clubs and athletes from across Australia was down, which affected the quality and depth of athletes attending. The Worlds differ from a normal Australian Carnival in that you can only have so many competitors per team, and there are limits to the events and athletes that can compete in.

Over the past few years, the competition calendar for the season has steadily grown fuller, with a calendar of sport-specific events on nearly every weekend between October and April. Previous carnivals that were high on the agenda of athletes have fallen off the radar, with several clubs and athletes focusing on Tier 1 World Ocean Series carnivals, as well as State and Aussie carnivals. The same can be said for our Nippers. In the past, The Sydney Water Series was a must for nippers, but with scheduling and club commitments, the ability to attend all proves challenging. We are fortunate to have 2 of the biggest carnivals of the season at our beach, being the Race One Nipper Nats and the Shaw and Partners Manly Open Classic. This year, we teamed up with NSWLSA's Beach Stormers to have the finale at the Manly Open Classic. We are hopeful that this exposure improves the attendance figures of beach athletes.

Our Open team (15-Open) is smaller than in previous seasons, with several of our older Opens transitioning to the next stage of their lives, yet still providing leadership to our youth who are moving into the Opens. MLSC is fortunate in that we have a very large nursery, and over the past 20+ years, they have been exposed to great coaching and leadership from the JAC committee to help upskill them into being good water people.

Our current batch of U15S is right up there in quality and depth on the competition side, and they are nice kids. So, the future looks promising. Throughout the season, our U15S have excelled during the WOS, State and Aussies: Henry Whitehead won the U15 Male Board race and was up the pointy end of results over the season. Our U15 boys' Cameron team won silver at the Aussies and dominated that event throughout the season. Coupled with the depth of the boys and girls across the 14s and 15s, the Sky-Blue cap will be seen a lot more in the coming years.





## Deputy President - Competition

One of the main attributes of a great coach and squad is the impression they leave on an individual. We have all been exposed to people throughout our lives who influence our development as individuals. I am very proud of our coaches, Scott, Jono, Rach, Mike, Alicia, Kelly, Sophie and Tilla and how they project the quality and decency that we want our kids to have.

The carnival results will be in the annual report, with a special mention to our Australian U19 Double Ski silver medallist, Willem Riddington and Keaton Ronge Smith. To win an Open competition medal at The Aussies is extremely hard, with the conditions for the Opens leading to very close racing. Both Willem and Keaton are first-year U19S and paced 4<sup>th</sup> in this event last year as U17S.

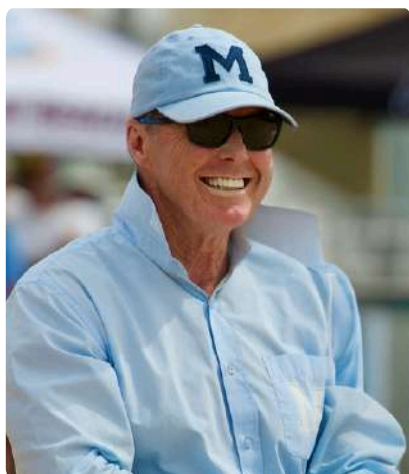
Kenrick Louis competed in the Shaw and Partners Irons Series, it was a different format this season with athletes knocked out at the completion of a weekend's events, Kenj was in a very strong position after the first days racing but strained his calf on day 2 which forced his hand and he had to retire from the days racing which ultimately meant his end to this year's series.

Our Masters team had another successful season with a place at 2nd State and 7th at Aussies. In a few weeks' time, there will be the state conference, which is looking to have masters' events cover a 10-year age group instead of the 5-year age grouping as current.

Manly has had a long history in Surf Boats, we now have a sweep and a masters female crew. Dave Maguire, our boat sweep, has added a men's reserve crew to his stable, and hopefully, a few more crews will join over the next few years.

Surf sports competition covers a range of disciplines, there's something for everyone across beach/water/boats/lifesaving/surfing/IRB/R&R and first aid. If Manly wants to be competitive across the disciplines, then we require athletes and parents who want to compete in these events.

Thank you to our Competition Manager, Glenn Stone, who does the entries for the opens and provides guidance to Michael Bochner (Masters) and Katie Chalmers (Nippers) and keeps me in check. The Competition team ticks over with people in the background doing work that a lot of people do not see, thank you to Dave Robinson, Tommy Garrett, Greg Gordon, Luke Chalmers, Andy Whitehead and all the parents that answer the call to help move tents, load craft and provide support to the team. See you all over winter and summer, and let's see what the 25/26 season holds.





## Masters Report

The season started in October with the Coolangatta Gold endurance event. This is a challenging event that involves long-distance ski, board paddling, swimming, and running. The long course is a combined 41km, and the short course is 21km. Manly Masters were represented by several teams, with the Manly Merchandisers finishing 3<sup>rd</sup> in the Women’s short course and the Manly Legends 5<sup>th</sup> in the 190+ Male Teams event. The Coolangatta Gold can be a physically and logistically challenging event. Still, if you’re looking for inspiration to keep your training going strong through the cold winter months, this event is a great motivator.

October brought the inaugural Mona Vale Masters carnival: a small teams event carnival, and concluded with the prestigious inflatable swan race: It was difficult to figure out who won, with all the splashing (There did seem to be a lot of cheating, with the rules for inflatable toy competition still under development!).

The Freshwater Masters in November was a reasonably large local carnival featuring competitors from all over the Sydney region. We had 46 competitors and won the overall point score easily. Manly won the 110 and 150 Surf teams, the 130 and 150 ski relay, the 110 and 170 board relay and the 110 and 170 Taplin. We also had a lot of 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> places, too many to mention. Thanks to Kaija Wall and Simone Hill for officiating.

We competed at a very relaxed and fun carnival at Palm Beach in January 2025. This was also a team-only event, with a handicapping system that distributes the prizes very generously (followed by a BBQ on the lawn of the very classy and exclusive Palm Beach Surf Club).

Branch Champs took place at Newport in February. The conditions can be challenging at Newport, with a shore-break that can literally ‘break’ things. The entire event was postponed last season, but this year the Masters events went ahead (although Joe Badaoui and Salli Alderson suffered injuries during their races). Our overall results were excellent, with Manly a close 2<sup>nd</sup> in the SNB Beach Championships. Manly was 1<sup>st</sup> in the SNB Masters Water Championships with 337 points. This was a dominant win with Freshwater, the next club, on 198 points. Many thanks to Jocelyn Webb, Kaija Wall, Jan Proudfoot, Geoff Dixon, Michael Kember, Sheena OBierne and Nina Gordon for officiating. Thanks to Kit Lloyd for doing the IRB shift.



## Masters Report

The NSW State Masters Champs were held at North Steyne in March over 2 days. The entire event was in serious doubt due to the wild weather. Still, as the sun rose on the first day, it presented near-perfect conditions (we got very lucky - the Nippers States had been held at Shelly Beach only a few days prior because of the dangerous surf). Manly was 2<sup>nd</sup> overall in the NSW State masters championships, behind Bondi. This is an outstanding result that belongs to the entire club, because our Masters team is a diverse group of people. We have nipper parents, active patrolling members, life members, long service members, club officers, parents of opens competitors, ex-Olympians and some beginners who did their bronze in 2024. Most importantly, we have a balanced mix of age and gender. Very few clubs have such a strong and diverse Masters competition group. Thanks to John Singleton, Nina Gordon and Alan Tier for officiating at State Masters.

Aussies were held at North Kirra in late March over 2 days. We had a team of 34 competitors and finished 7<sup>th</sup> overall. The event had almost been cancelled because of a cyclone that had caused massive damage to infrastructure and the foreshore, but by the time the Masters event was held, the conditions were reasonably good. Aussies is an interesting event due to its sheer scale and the opportunity to race against competitors from across Australia. Thanks to Nina Gorton, Christine Armour, Bec Crawford, Mel Thomas and Jocelyn Webb for officiating.

You may have noticed that I mentioned the officials by name in this report. Our entries to carnivals are restricted by a strictly enforced quota system for officials, generally a 1 to 10 ratio. We were fortunate to have such generous people willing to spend their day volunteering, allowing us to participate in these events. We did not need to restrict entry numbers this season, but we may need to in future.

I worked as an official at the NSW State Championships, so I had a great view of the racing. One of my proudest moments of the season was watching the Manly Women's double ski teams dominate their events at state level. We had six women's double ski teams, and they all either won their race or came 2<sup>nd</sup> to another Manly team. Surf Lifesaving has traditionally been a male-dominated movement, and before 1980, females were not eligible to participate in Nippers. This has had a flow-on effect for the Surf Lifesaving Masters competition, as women aged over 40 have taken up surf sports later in life. It also explains why there are so many excellent women surf swimmers but relatively few female ski paddlers: The surf ski is still a predominantly male-dominated area. Manly has a history of supporting/encouraging/developing women in surf lifesaving, and it's part of our culture. The fact that we can field six excellent masters women's double ski teams at the NSW Titles should be celebrated. Very few clubs in Australia can do that.

### **Moonlighters – Masters Women’s Crew**

The 2024/25 season began early for the Moonlighters, with an ambitious training schedule leading into the World Championships on the Gold Coast. The crew, having trained through winter, earned a gold medal in the Masters 200s division, beating one of the few international teams from France. It was a major highlight and an incredible way to kick off the season.

Following Worlds, the crew underwent a few changes, with new members stepping into key seats. Despite this, the Moonlighters remained committed to the full surf sports calendar and trained consistently. The squad showed great adaptability, maintaining performance while supporting each other's development.

Throughout the season, the Moonlighters competed at all major carnivals. They secured:

- Gold at the ASRL Open (Masters division)
- Gold at the Sydney Northern Beaches Branch Championships
- Silver at the NSW State Titles
- Silver at the Aussies (Australian Surf Life Saving Championships)

As sweep and coach, Dave Maguire led the team through challenging surf conditions, close finishes, and competitive fields. The consistency of results across major carnivals is a testament to the team's resilience, fitness, and unity. Whether in the boat or around the club, the Moonlighters set a great example of competitive and community spirit.

### **Manly Majestics – Rebuilding Men’s Surf Boat Rowing at Manly**

In November 2024, the club saw the formation of the Manly Majestics, the first men’s surf boat crew at Manly since 2017. Starting with no prior experience, the group responded to an open invitation to “come and try” rowing and quickly committed to developing into a competitive team.

Under Dave Maguire’s guidance, the Majestics trained up to four mornings a week, progressing from basic skills in the flat water of Little Manly and Shelly Beach to surf conditions at Manly. Early sessions were filled with steep learning curves—learning rowing technique, timing, commands, and surf awareness—but the crew showed remarkable dedication. The team debuted at the Collaroy carnival and went on to race at the Branch and NSW State Championships. They improved with every race, holding their own against more experienced and established crews. At State, the Majestics narrowly missed progressing to the semifinals—a major milestone for such a new team.

Their efforts also had a noticeable impact on the wider club. The return of a men’s crew was warmly received by the Manly LSC community, with many expressing support both online and in person. Their journey has sparked interest from additional club members, with a dozen expressing interest in joining the section next season.

## Off the Water – Equipment, Support & Community

A lot of time and effort went into supporting the boat section off the water. Dave Maguire maintained all equipment during the season, including stripping and recoating the 'Tony Dawes' boat and oars, servicing the trailer, and transporting boats to carnivals. His behind-the-scenes work was critical to the section's success. Both the Moonlighters and Majestics contributed to broader club activities, including fulfilling patrol duties and volunteering at community events such as the Cole Classic, further strengthening the link between surf sports and the lifesaving mission of Manly LSC.

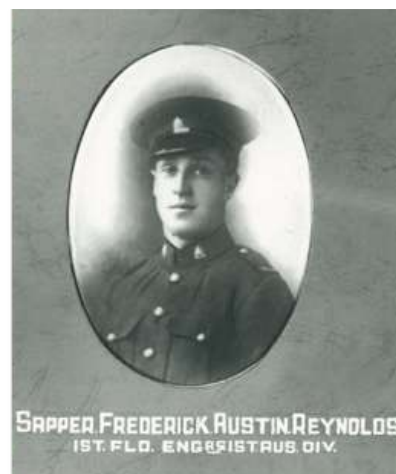

# ANZAC Day 2025

***Lest we forget***

This year's commemorations brought together Club members, families, and the broader Manly community to reflect on service, sacrifice, and the strong ties between surf lifesaving and the Australian Defence Force. At first light, members gathered on Manly Beach for a moving tradition that started five years ago.

Just before 6:00 am, 46 lanterns—each representing a Manly LSC or Manly Surf Club member who served and did not return from WWI or WWII—were placed in the sand. Initially created by our Nippers in 2020, these hand-decorated lanterns offered a quiet, intimate tribute to the lives behind the history. At 9:00 am, the Club's official ANZAC service began, led by Deputy President of Lifesaving, Rebecca Crawford. Her thoughtful delivery guided attendees through a meaningful service.

We were honoured to welcome Corporal Dan Richmond, Special Operations Command, as keynote speaker. His moving address reflected on duty and resilience, and he shared the story of Sapper Frederick Austin Reynolds—killed at Anzac Cove on 25 April 1915—who, unknown to many until now, was a member of Manly LSC.

Junior Club Captains Alanna Toouli and Saxon Goodwin delivered the Prayers of Remembrance with poise, followed by Club Chaplain Ken Buckley's Prayer for ANZAC Day.

## Nipper Treasurer

Manly Nippers continues to be self-funded while contributing to key expenses of the broader Manly LSC, including equipment, building maintenance, and storage. We recorded a surplus of \$35,086 for the 2024/25 season (2023/24: \$51,838), which will be reinvested into the nipper program.

Our main revenue source are Nipper registration fees, which were slightly lower than last season (\$61,845 v \$64,190). This trend is consistent with a nationwide decrease in nipper numbers. A portion of this revenue goes toward SLS capitation charges, covering costs including insurance.

Our main fundraising BBQ contributed a net \$24,895 this year. We're grateful for the continued support from Harris Farm for our two major event BBQs. Despite significant increased costs for our regular Sunday BBQs however, they still raised valuable funds.

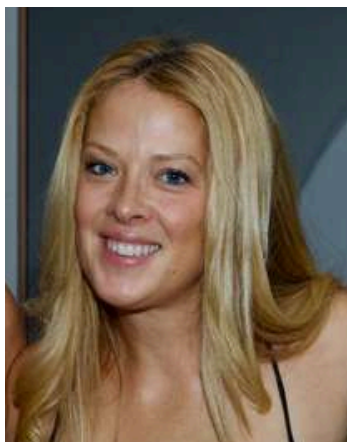
Our successful training camps have now become a key club fundraiser. The pre-season Sawtell camp and Manly summer camp delivered a combined profit of \$24,245, which goes directly to supporting our expanding coaching program. This program has grown due to increased participation in training, resulting in higher coaching and competition entry costs. A big thanks to our coaching team, led by Rachel Crerar and Michael Kember, and supported by our army of dedicated volunteers.

We also hosted several social events that were mostly self-funded with some club support, helping to strengthen the inclusive, family-focused culture at Manly Nippers. Highlights included our welcome function, State dinner, and end-of-season celebration.

Overall, Manly Nippers continues to strengthen its financial position, enabling future investment in both our sport and the wider surf life saving community at Manly.



## Nipper Registrar

This season, we welcomed 578 registered Nippers to Manly Surf Life Saving Club. While this number was slightly lower than last year, we were pleased that registration remained open throughout, reflecting both the strength of our program and the dedication of our volunteer community.

### Training and Competition

Among our U9–U14 age groups, more than 125 Nippers chose to join the training and competition team, showcasing Manly Team’s enthusiasm for surf sports and skill development. Their participation reflects the high level of engagement and talent within our club.

### Sunday Nippers

Our season launched with a special U6 introductory session, followed by our first full Sunday Nippers session in October, which saw over 350 Nippers taking over Manly Beach.

### Volunteer Support and Proficiencies

Running the Nippers program relies on a huge network of parent volunteers. This includes delivering surf education, providing water safety, age managers, carnival officials and conducting swim proficiencies—both in the pool and in the ocean—for nearly 270 children. To streamline the start of the season, we commenced monthly pool proficiencies in July for the U9–U14 age groups. This early initiative was a success, allowing us to complete many assessments ahead of time. However, we encourage greater uptake next year to help reduce pressure on our volunteers during the peak season. Each pool proficiency session requires approximately 20 hours of volunteer effort alone.

### Camps and Community

Our Sawtell and Summer Camps continue to be highlights of the Nippers calendar. This season, over 150 participants attended Sawtell and 115 participated in the Summer Camp. For the first time, we had to close Sawtell registrations early to ensure we maintained the appropriate coach-to-water safety ratios—essential for delivering a safe, structured, and enjoyable experience for all.

### Acknowledgements

A heartfelt thank you to everyone who made this season a success—from our qualified Age Managers and Water Safety personnel, to every parent who helped out with morning teas, packed camp lunches, or stood over the BBQ at Sunday Nippers. Your time, effort, and spirit make this program possible. We look forward to another exciting and safe season ahead.

### Ross Ryan

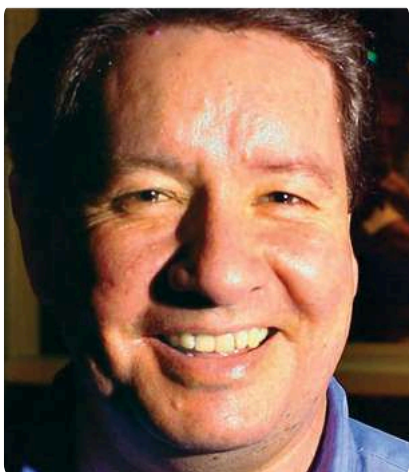

# Treasurer's Report

The financial year continued to present curveballs arising from the broader economic environment and our ageing club premises. Against unfavourable currents: I am pleased to report an operating surplus of \$157,047, a 40% increase on the prior year and, importantly, in line with our budget.

- Cash balances continued to grow to \$1.567m at the end of the financial year, \$133k (9%) higher than the prior year. Over \$1m remains on term deposit, the majority secured before interest rates eased in February 2025. The Board and finance committee continue to monitor our cash position and ensure the maximum return for our club.
- Revenues increased 11% compared to the prior year. We are grateful to our growing cohort of generous donors and sponsors who continue to support our club and, of course, our members. The Cole Classic netted its largest ever profit. The Club's new merchandise is selling well. Our two new BBQs have paid for themselves multiple times over with increased capacity, generating increased revenue (and many happy customers!). Membership also increased, a testament to the community spirit espoused by the Club.
- Events continue to inspire the community, providing opportunities to volunteer, complete their first ocean swim event, or ignite a spark to join the Club or support the club financially. Events also contribute to Manly LSC's support for the broader community. Since Manly LSC took over the Cole Classic in 2020, participants have raised over \$1m for charities. You will also see friendly patrol members providing First Aid (and occasionally dancing the Nut Bush) at the annual Rotary Fun Run and other local events.
- Competition results continue to improve across Nippers, Youth, Opens and Masters' categories, reflecting the investment in coaching and athlete support. The number of "pink vests" seen on "dawn patrol", returning to the club before 7am (for a "Brew with a view"! ) shows the dedication of an increasing cohort of members to training (and ~20,000 hot showers netting \$4,000!).
- A 60% increase in investment in education and Patrols (partly funded by generous donations) has enabled Manly to offer more courses free of charge to members to facilitate upskilling, reskilling, building confidence and capability on and off the water.
- Operating expenses increased by 40%, as a result of general cost increases, the hall interior refresh, upgrading the Clubs Wifi, and the first full year of full time office staff including our wonderful Operations Manager Leanne O'Neill and her small but mighty team who continue to deliver cost and operational efficiencies, address the increasing compliance obligations and the growing list of repairs and maintenance to our aging club building (building related costs increased 20%) whilst the rebuild wheels turn (slowly).

Thank you to Leanne O'Neill, Rob Eades and the office staff (Kat and Jen) for their dedication and diligence, ensuring the annual accounts and annual report once again met the high standards required of financial reporting and compliance obligations.

Thank you to our passionate and dedicated Board and Finance Committee, led by President Tim Cuthbert, and all who volunteer across the clubs operations, ensuring every dollar raised is applied to delivery of the clubs objectives.

Finally, thank you for the opportunity and privilege to serve the club as Treasurer – to protect our "Sky Blue" and contribute to the financial sustainability of our club for you, for us, for our local community and all who visit. Go manly and I'll see you on the beach (or in the water!!)

### Note 1

#### Summary of Significant Accounting Policy

The financial statements cover Manly Life Saving Club as an individual entity. MANLY LIFE SAVING CLUB INC. is a not-for-profit Association incorporated in New South Wales under the Associations Incorporation Act 2009 (NSW).

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act 2009 (NSW), the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 (NSW) and the Australian Charities and Not-for-Profits Commission Act 2012 (Cth) and the club's constitution. The Board has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the above acts and regulations, the club's constitution and the following Australian Accounting Standards:

AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements

AASB 107 Statements of Cash Flows

AASB 108 Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors

AASB 1031 Materiality

AASB 1048 Interpretation of Accounting Standards

AASB 1054 Australian Additional Disclosures

No other Accounting Standards, Australian Accounting Interpretations or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

### Note 2

#### Accounting Recognition Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation. In the event the carrying value of plant and equipment is greater than the estimated recoverable amount, the carrying value is written down immediately to the estimated recoverable amount. A formal assessment of recoverable amount is made when impairment indicators are present. Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or recognised as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the association and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. All other repairs and maintenance are charged to the statement of comprehensive income during the financial period in which they are incurred.

#### Depreciation

The depreciation method and useful life used for items of property, plant and equipment (excluding freehold land) reflects the pattern in which their future economic benefits are expected to be consumed by the association. Depreciation commences from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements. The depreciation method and useful life of assets is reviewed annually to ensure they are still appropriate.

An asset's carrying amount is written down immediately to its recoverable amount if the asset's carrying amount is greater than its estimated recoverable amount.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains or losses are recognised in profit or loss. When revalued assets are sold, amounts included in the revaluation surplus relating to that asset are transferred to retained earnings.

#### Employee Provisions

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee provisions have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

#### Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

#### Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short-term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value. Bank overdrafts are presented within current liabilities on the statement of financial position.

#### Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

#### Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

## Note 2

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

### Financial Instruments

Recognition, initial measurement and derecognition :

Financial assets and financial liabilities are recognised when the Association becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the financial instrument, and are measured initially at fair value adjusted by transactions costs, except for those carried at fair value through profit or loss, which are measured initially at fair value. Subsequent measurement of financial assets and financial liabilities are described below.

Financial assets are derecognised when the contractual rights to the cash flows from the financial asset expire, or when the financial asset and all substantial risks and rewards are transferred. A financial liability is derecognised when it is extinguished, discharged, cancelled or expires.

Classification and subsequent measurement of financial assets

Except for those trade receivables that do not contain a significant financing component and are measured at the transaction price, all financial assets are initially measured at fair value adjusted for transaction costs (where applicable).

For the purpose of subsequent measurement, financial assets other than those designated and effective as hedging instruments are classified into the following categories upon initial recognition:

- amortised cost
- fair value through profit or loss (FVPL)
- equity instruments at fair value through other comprehensive income (FVOCI)

All income and expenses relating to financial assets that are recognised in profit or loss are presented within finance costs, finance income or other financial items, except for impairment of trade receivables which is presented within other expenses.

Classifications are determined by both:

- The entities business model for managing the financial asset
- The contractual cash flow characteristics of the financial assets

All income and expenses relating to financial assets that are recognised in profit or loss are presented within finance costs, finance income or other financial items, except for impairment of trade receivables, which is presented within other expenses.

### Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

### Inventories

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. No value is ascribed to goods for resale that have been donated to the Association where fair value cannot be reliably determined. Net realisable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business, less any applicable selling expenses.

### Accounts Payable and Other Payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

### Significant management judgement in applying accounting policies

When preparing the financial statements, management undertakes a number of judgements, estimates and assumptions about the recognition and measurement of assets, liabilities, income and expenses.

### Estimation uncertainty

Information about estimates and assumptions that have the most significant effect on recognition and measurement of assets, liabilities, income and expenses is provided below. Actual results may be substantially different.

### Impairment

In assessing impairment, management estimates the recoverable amount of each asset or cash-generating units, based on expected future cash flows and uses an interest rate to discount them. Estimation uncertainty relates to assumptions about future operating results and the determination of a suitable discount rate.

### Useful lives of depreciable assets

Management reviews its estimate of the useful lives of depreciable assets at each reporting date, based on the expected utility of the assets. Uncertainties in these estimates relate to technical obsolescence that may change the utility of certain software and IT equipment.

### Inventories

Management estimates the net realisable values of inventories, taking into account the most reliable evidence available at each reporting date. The future realisation of these inventories may be affected by future technology or other market-driven changes that may reduce future selling prices.

### Long service leave

The liability for long service leave is recognised and measured at the present value of the estimated cash flows to be made in respect of all employees at the reporting date. In determining the present value of the liability, estimates of attrition rates and pay increases through promotion and inflation have been taken into account.

### Related Party Transactions

The Association's related parties include its key management personnel and related entities as described below. Unless otherwise stated, none of the transactions incorporate special terms and conditions and no guarantees were given or received. Outstanding balances are usually settled in cash.
